Love can be divided into familial love, love of friendship, love of love and grace.

[1:35] In the context of familial love, for example, I believe everyone would agree a mother's love is possibly the greatest.

Mother's love will not because of the country or the nation are not the same, it will be a different. I mean, a mother's love transcends race and cultural backgrounds, no matter which country you are, your mothers will love their children.

And yeah, it transcends beyond racial and cultural boundaries. No matter which country you are from, you will always unconditionally and unfilessly love your children.

Especially when they are infants. We can see some of the children who have children with young children at our church.

I mean, let us look at the examples of all the mothers with young children at our church. They all love their children. We can also see these pictures of the mother's love. And from the following photos, we can also see the natural love and affection mothers have for their ladies.

These are the people's design in the human body. These are the people's DNA. Because this was God's design.

This was placed within a woman's DNA by God. Of course, that's not to say that the father also does not have the same love for their children, but they usually express it a little bit differently.

Our fathers are a little bit more conservative, especially in Asian cultures. And love is similar even in friendship.

If you are standing in any way, if you are sharing this kind of love, you will give and receive. No matter what kind of character you are, as long as there is grace within you, you will be generous and selfless.

If you are not alone, you will be generous and selfless. A mother's love for her children is like this, as is friendship. There is a priest who knew that his son needed to need a kidney transplant.

For example, once upon a time there was a pastor who knew that a brother in Christ needed a kidney transplant. He just gave his son to this child. So he gave his own kidney to save his brother's life.

This is grace. Of course, the pastor must have known his church member for a long time.

[6:33] And they must have had a close, friendly relationship. However, if the pastor did not have such grace as a motivation, he would not have given his kidney. I mean, if it were you, and you were not motivated by grace, would you donate your kidney?

So let us think, if you were to donate a kidney, perhaps to your own family member, you might be able to persuade yourself quite easily. However, what if we asked you to donate it to a completely unrelated stranger?

I think, if it were not for God's inspiration, this would never happen. This is the God's inspiration. This is the God's inspiration. And hence, in the above example, this is God's grace allowing the pastor to have such a generous heart giving his kidney.

Giving his kidney. There are many other people who have been able to donate their kidney. And they will also be able to donate their kidney. These examples are in relation to grace, some to the extent that even one is worth giving his life.

[10:12] But comparing this to God's grace, you may feel it is even more irrational. God's love is over this logic. Because sometimes God's love seems almost beyond logic. God's love is beyond traditional standards of morality and justice.

Because God's love is derived from his heart of mercy, his grace. God's love is beyond the grace of God's grace.

However, the recipients of God's grace are often not worth such grace. In the past, we said about the sins of the people who are saved. We would think that these people are worth our sacrifice.

I mean, previously we talked about examples of self-sacrifice, and how we admire and praise such actions. But you would think that these people would like to give His Son to His Son. They would like to give His Son to His Son to His Son.

However, let us think, the recipients of the sacrifice that the people previously made, are they worth the sacrifice? But if you think that if they were not worth the sacrifice, you would like to give them?

[11:23] And if they were, what if the recipients, in another case, were not worth the sacrifice? Would you still make that sacrifice? Perhaps the people you are trying to sacrifice for enemies.

But... But... ...

It is God's grace that is able to allow us to accomplish such things, to defy logic and traditional values of justice. The Lord said before, in this example, it means that the sacrifice of the people's sins.

The first one used the parable, the parable of the prodigal son, to show God's grace to sinners. The son completely ignored the father's dignity, wasted his family property, and eventually returned home to his father empty handed.

When he was not at the door, his father was very far away. But even before he got to the front door, his father had seen him from a long way away. I believe that his father was always standing in the door, to see the child's son, is not coming back.

[12:45] His father perhaps waited for him at the door every day, hoping that his son would return. So, when he went to his father's face, and hadn't been open to his father's face, to say, ...

[14:04] Sometimes Chinese parents perhaps even watch children's children. I was like that to teach them to teach them.

Finally, I don't want to wait for them to say sorry to God. But then I changed my ways. Instead of waiting for them to say sorry to me, I instead said I was wrong, I apologize to God.

Because it was my fault. So let us come back to reviewing the parable about the prodigal son.

This child hadn't seen the father's door open, he said sorry to me, his father had already put the best clothes and the body to celebrate. Even as the son returned, before he even had the chance to say I'm sorry, the father had already embraced him, given him new clothes, ordered a calf to be slaughtered and threw a party to celebrate.

Why was this? Why was this? Let's see what the Bible says. The Bible says, The reason was, when the father saw the son and the fact that he was in need, his compassion overcame him.

[15:49] This is the reason of the compassion. And with the heart of compassion, with the heart of mercy, he made a decision. Now let's look at the second point.

Love is to give a sacrifice. And now to give a sacrifice. We often say, love is a sweet word.

We often say, love is giving, love is sacrifice. You are a benefit. As such, it requires a price to be paid. Whether it is a maternal love, or whether it is a love between friends.

Or even God's selfless love. It all requires sacrifice, it all requires a price to be paid.

[31:59] Hence, marriage is a very outward expression, you don't do it in secret. So, we must always share our love outwardly.

How can we really understand that the love of God is true? So, well...

There is a example, there is a one-hundred-fuh-yong that says, I will give you one hundred-fuh-yong. You are very sweet.

[33:00] You will really feel that this is a good thing. In all honesty, you probably won't feel that he is being very gracious with you because it doesn't mean all that much to him.

Sometimes, we are thinking that God's love is like this. And I guess sometimes, when we think of God's love, we may feel it is like this. God giving us something very small to him, but very big to us.

Because the reason is that you don't understand that the love of God is the reason why it is the reason for the people to give his love. But perhaps, this is because we ourselves don't understand what it means for God to have loved sinners.

Because God, God's love, has paid a huge cost. The Bible says, The Bible says, The Bible says, The Bible says, And what verse is better, but John 3, 16, For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.

This is because we all perceive grace as something that is free. And a lot of times, when we see something for free, we take it for granted.

We do not treasure it. For example, if people are handing out things for free on the street, you don't really feel it's worth anything.

If someone tells you, if you're the one who says, I love the new Jesus, the new people are good. If you're just a few words, you can go to the temple. It's easy. I mean, in the same way, if someone is preaching the gospel to you to believe in Christ, to believe in eternal life, good. Just by raising a hand, you can not go to hell and go to heaven.

Too easy. Today, I just tell you, God gives us this gift to us. Just to give us the gift of grace. But I tell you today that the grace that God has freely given to us was for a great cost to Him.

[36:57] Because God's cost was His own Son, Jesus Christ, bleeding His precious blood on the cross. You thought it was a waste. No. It's just that this gift is not for us. I mean, you think it's free, but it is not.

It is just that we ourselves do not need to pay for it. It is just that we are the best of the money. Romans 6, 23, it tells us, the wages of sin are dead.

Jesus has already paid us for this time. But Jesus Christ has paid this cost, this wage, on our behalf. You should, I'll give you another example. Perhaps I'll give you another example.

Just as we said before, you know, maybe if we raise our hands and give our life, say we give our life to God, that we'll have eternal life. It's very cheap and easy. We don't need to have any cost.

But we cannot just use our mouth to spread the gospel. God's grace and love must be shown by our actions.

We don't need to use our words. Just mere words. Because otherwise it would become an empty gospel.

[40:42] In our new church, we need to use our life to show Jesus' truth. After we believe in God, we need to use our lives to demonstrate, to live as a testimony for Christ Jesus.

Perhaps I can use this kind of example. When we go to our Alpha course, it's like us going to kindergarten.

Once we start believing in God, it's like we've graduated and gone to primary school. We need to join our family, to join our group, to join our group.

After we start participating in our soul groups and reading and studying the Bible, it's as if we go into high school. Our goal is not to be on the ground, it's on the ground. And our ultimate goal is entering the university not on earth, the university that is heaven.

God has already prepared us for our family. I mean, God in all our family communities has all these primary and secondary schools available for us to use.
